Meeting called to order by the Faithful Navigator at 5:05 PM

OLD BUSINESS:

Automatic door opener for main entrance proposal will be taken up at the next Parish Council meeting and if they decide to do it, it will not be necessary for the Assembly to pay for it. This is how it was put to Mike Baricevich by the Church Office.

Veteran's Day parade plans will be a long trailer with seats for veterans to ride but needs to have safety rails installed which will be done at Jerry Holtman's house on Sunday, October 31st in the early afternoon and we will need volunteers; we will provide food for workers. Plans for Veteran's Day parade will be the trailer/Veterans float, 3 National Guard Humvees and a four plane fly-over on November 11th led by Sir Knight Tim Kolp.

Sir Knight Doug Blake reported that Communion ware, Ciborium's and Chalices in memorial of deceased Sir Knights have been donated to the new Smith County Parish and some other parishes at the request of the families. Therefore, we will not suspend the giving of Communion Ware to the families of deceased Sir Knights and their spouses.

NEW BUSINESS:

Purser report: \$6,469.92 currently in our checking account. Approximately \$1,400 will be spent to replenish our Communion ware stock.

State Fourth District Master likes our Fallen Knight Ceremony and has requested a copy of our script. Our Assembly Fallen Knight ceremony will be held on Sunday, October 10th at 5:00 PM on the prayer path below the lower parking lot. All Knights are welcome to attend

Motion was made by Dan Bernier to spend whatever money that was needed to replenish our stock of Communion ware, second by Tony Gosse; discussion was held and vote was unanimous in favor. Some members have used the offered stipend of \$150 to purchase regalia and there are 8 stipends left reported John Bolger, Faithful Comptroller.

Good of the order and the meeting was closed with a prayer and blessing.

Roth IRAs: A Less Taxing Way to Save

Did you know that you can establish a Roth IRA through the Knights of Columbus? If you haven't set up a Roth IRA for this year, there's still time to take advantage of this great way to save for retirement.

The total you can contribute depends on your income, but you can do so regardless of whether you participate in a pension plan.

Although your contributions aren't deductible, the long-range benefits of a Roth IRA should be compared to those of a traditional IRA. For starters, many people earn too much for a traditional IRA to be a tax deduction. And with a Roth IRA you avoid the age-70 1/2 minimum distribution requirements that come with a traditional IRA.

You can establish a Roth IRA, and make your yearly contribution, up to the date you file your tax return for that year (excluding extensions). But annual contributions to a Roth IRA aren't required. All interest you earn is federal income tax-free, provided you withdraw your funds under certain "qualified distribution" rules.

If you'd like more information about Roth IRAs – or traditional IRAs - I can help. But do it soon. Saving as much as you can for retirement is always a wise move, and the earlier you start, the better.
